


Sneak Peek of Cast Dashboard on Forced Criminality

This year, the Urban Institute and the <u>Microsoft Justice Reform Initiative</u> selected Cast as one of 25 organizations across the country to participate in the 2023 <u>Catalyst Grant Program</u> to use data and technology to advance racial equity and reform in the criminal legal system in three front-end focus areas: prevention, policing, and prosecution. Cast's project is on 'forced criminality': when traffickers force people to engage in illegal activities such as theft. Cast is developing an interactive dashboard with analyses of Cast data, guidelines for practitioners interested in collecting data, and free resources. The final dashboard will be available on Cast's website in January.

Supervisors Support Efforts to End Slavery as Punishment in California

"Neither slavery nor involuntary servitude, except as a punishment for crime whereof the party shall have been duly convicted, shall exist within the United States, or any place subject to their jurisdiction."

The 13th Amendment to the United States Constitution, adopted in 1865, abolished slavery and involuntary servitude *except as a punishment for a crime*. This exception has allowed prisons to force inmates to work for little or no compensation. Cast commends LA County Supervisors <u>Lindsey Horvath</u> and <u>Holly Michell</u> for authoring a motion supporting California state bill ACA-8 that would explicitly prohibit the use of slavery and involuntary servitude as a punishment for a crime in California. We will continue to support all parties working to 'end the exception'. You can view Cast's letter of support for the motion <u>here</u>.
