

## HUMAN TRAFFICKING VICTIM ASSISTANCE (HV) PROGRAM

The following twenty-one projects received Cal OES grants for the fiscal years 2016-2018. Eleven projects have a 24-month grant period of April 1, 2016 through March 31, 2018 (denoted by \*). The remaining ten projects have a grant period of April 1, 2017 through March 31, 2019 (denoted by \*\*). Programs have received notification their funding will be extended for another year given the 2019 budget allocations.
